# How to "fix" a rejected ballot

Did any of the following happen? 1. You were issued a provisional absentee ballot OR 2. Your absentee ballot was rejected OR 3. You did not provide an ID when you voted Fixing your ballot is called "curing" it

## You must fix you ballot by 5pm Friday Nov 6th

Georgia Code § 21-2-386 states "If ballot is rejected, the voter is promptly notified of rejection."

The voter then has until 3 days after the election to submit voter ID in conjunction with an affidavit confirming the ballot was in fact theirs in order to cure the ballot.

### Step 2: Sign the Affidavit

If your ballot was rejected the county should send you an affidavit to sign. Or they will have copies at the registrar's office.

#### Just in case:

- 1. <u>Form for provisional</u> <u>absentee ballot</u>
- 2. Form for ballot signature cure

Sign and print your name. Make sure your signature looks like the one on your ID.

### Step 3: Show your ID and Return Your Affidavit

In theory, your affidavit and ID can be delivered personally, by a third party, or via fax or email. Contact your county registrar to confirm how to submit.
