

# **Cooperative Agreements / Substantial EPA Involvement**

- Team of EPA Project Officers assigned to each EJ TCTAC
- Each team will work hand-in-hand with their EJ TCTAC and meet regularly for collaboration, strategizing, and assessment
- Substantial involvement will ensure meaningful progress and efficient/effective grant performance
- DOE personnel will also provide guidance and oversight to the TCTAC network

#### **Coordination with Other Agency TA Efforts**

• EJ TCTACs will plan and coordinate with other federal TA providers to leverage each other's offerings and minimize duplication (as much as practicable).

ABOUT: EJ - CPS provides funding for projects that address local environmental/public health issues within an affected community & assists recipients in building collaborative partnerships to address local environmental /public health concerns. Projects must demonstrate the use of EPA's 7-Step CPS Model.

WHO'S ELIGIBLE: Non-Profit

Organization, and Non-Profit Org's within U.S. Territories & Freely Associated States (FAS) Tribes.

anvironmental harms and risks

#### WHO'S ELIGIBLE

- A partnership ( FUT) a state and a community-based nonprofit organization. (Anticipate 20 awards under this track)
- A partnership between a tribe and a community-based nonprofit organization. (Anticipate 20 awards under this track)
- A partnership between a local government and a community-based nonprofit organization. (Anticipate 20 awards

- US Territories, Freely Associated States, and tribal governments in remote areas. (Anticipate 10 awards under this track).
