

Public Comment opportunities for proposed “SSE4” and “MSX” methane gas pipelines

The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) will be offering in-person public comment sessions where community members and landowners can share their concerns about the project and its environmental impacts.

FERC is the federal agency responsible for regulating interstate pipelines, including the proposed Mississippi Crossing (MSX) and South System Expansion 4 (SSE4) projects.

What is the SSE4/MSX pipeline project?

This proposed project – technically two connected projects treated as one – would significantly expand an existing pipeline across Alabama and Georgia (SSE4) and build new pipeline infrastructure across Mississippi (MSX). The new and expanded pipeline is proposed to transport methane gas – a fossil fuel – to multiple locations in Alabama, Georgia, and South Carolina, including power plants which will burn gas to generate electricity.

What is a public comment?

A public comment is an opportunity for you to voice your concerns about the pipeline project. For example, if you are a landowner, you can comment about the pipeline’s proposed route and its impact on your property. You can also comment on the environmental impacts of the pipeline, such as water, air, and soil impacts.

Why is this comment period happening?

FERC is required by federal law to file a draft report about the environmental impacts of major projects. The Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) was filed on Jan. 30, 2026, and **the public has until March 23rd by 5 pm ET to provide public comment.** The DEIS is 1,120 pages long and looks at the significant environmental impacts including alternatives to the projects, water resources, wildlife and fisheries, and socioeconomics.

What can I comment on?

You do not need to read all 1,120 pages. But **FERC is looking for comments on *specific environmental issues or concerns.*** If you are comfortable, you should share your personal experiences with FERC—whether that is a specific river you like to fish or swim in that might be impacted, past experiences with the existing pipelines, or safety concerns you might have about pipeline construction and operation. You can be as specific as you’d like and can even ask FERC to answer certain questions as part of its review process.

What can I expect at the public comment session?

FERC has not shared the exact meeting format, but based on past experience we expect something like the following: You will have the opportunity to speak with FERC staff, view maps, and ask questions about the project. If you would like to comment, you will move to a separate area, and your verbal comments will be recorded in a one-on-one format with a member of FERC staff present.

A court reporter will transcribe your spoken comments, and they will be placed in the official record which can later be viewed online. You may be limited to 5 minutes depending on how many people comment.
